Summer RV & Campervan Packing Checklist — BC Sea to Sky Corridor

Built for RV & campervan renters • Sea to Sky corridor, BC • Summer edition

BEFORE YOU PACK:

Check what your specific rental listing includes — bedding, kitchen gear and camp chairs vary by host. Message them if unclear.

■ CHECK YOUR RENTAL FIRST

- Bedding / linen kit included?**
Message host before booking if unclear
- Cookware & utensils included?**
Pots, pans, knives, spatulas etc.
- Crockery & cups included?**
Plates, bowls, mugs, glasses
- Camp chairs included?**
One per person minimum
- BBQ or outdoor grill included?**
Often available as a paid add-on
- RV toilet paper provided?**
Standard TP can block RV waste tanks

■ BEDDING & SLEEPING

- Fitted sheets + pillowcases**
Check bed size in your listing (usually queen or double)
- Duvet or sleeping bag**
Sea to Sky nights can drop below 10°C even in July
- Extra blanket / fleece throw**
For evenings outside or cold mornings
- Your own pillow**
Always better than whatever's there
- Eye mask**
BC summer = daylight until 10pm
- Earplugs**
Busy campgrounds can be noisy

■ KITCHEN & COOKING

- Camp stove + fuel canisters**
Check fire bans FIRST: bcwildfire.gov.bc.ca
- French press / travel coffee maker**
Don't count on rental to have a good one
- Portable cooler + ice packs**
For lake days and hiking days away from the RV
- Reusable water bottles (2L+ pp)**
Essential for hiking days
- Airtight food containers**
Bear country — store food securely always
- Can opener + corkscrew**
Rental often won't have these
- Small spice kit**
Salt, pepper, olive oil — rarely provided
- Dish soap, sponge, small basin**
For washing up at sites without hookups
- Ziplock bags + tin foil**
- Garbage bags (x5+)**
- Reusable grocery/tote bags**
For shops, beach days, carrying to the lake

■ CLOTHING (PER PERSON)

- T-shirts x 4–5**
- Long-sleeve base layers x 2**
Merino wool if possible — resists odour
- Fleece or mid-layer jacket**
For evenings — even July gets cool
- Waterproof shell jacket**
Non-optional in BC. Weather changes fast
- Casual shorts x 2**
- Hiking pants or convertibles**
- Underwear x 7**
- Wool / synthetic hiking socks x 4**
No cotton — blisters guaranteed
- Swimsuit**
Alice Lake, Brohm Lake, Nairn Falls — you will swim
- Pyjamas / warm lounge wear**
For evenings inside the RV
- Beanie + light gloves**
Cold mornings are real even in peak summer

■ HIKING BOOTS (BROKEN IN!)

- BEAR SPRAY** Carry it in an accessible holster at all times on trails — not in the bottom of your bag.
- FIRE BANS** Check your stop at bcwildfire.gov.bc.ca — can affect camp stoves too.
- Camp sandals / flip flops**
For campsites, showers, beach walks especially important for the Sea to Sky corridor
- Comfortable walking shoes / trainers**
For town walks, cafés, markets

■ CAMPSITE COMFORT

- Camp chairs (1 per person)**
Check if rental includes — buy/borrow if not
- Small camp table**
For eating, games, putting drinks on
- Outdoor mat / rug for RV door**
Keeps mud out, makes space feel homey
- LED string lights or lantern**
Transforms your campsite in the evening
- Bluetooth speaker**
Be considerate with volume at busy sites
- Camp games**
Frisbee, bocce, cards — evenings are long and lovely
- Firewood / firestarter**
Check fire ban level before ANY fire
- S'mores supplies**
A non-negotiable if you have kids (or adults)
- Camp coffee essentials**
Filters, ground coffee, sugar, powdered milk

■ TOILETRIES & HEALTH

- Biodegradable soap & shampoo**
Required near waterways. Dr. Bronner's is great
- Sunscreen (extra supply)**
You will use more than you think
- Insect repellent**
- Toothbrush + toothpaste + floss**
- Deodorant**
- RV-safe toilet paper**
Scott Rapid-Dissolving — buy before you go
- Hand sanitizer**
- First aid kit**
Blister pads, ibuprofen, antihistamine, antiseptic
- Prescription medications**
Stock up — options limited in smaller towns
- Hair ties + any hair tools**

■ DOCUMENTS & ADMIN

- Driver's licence**
Confirm driver is on RV rental agreement
- RVezy / rental booking confirmation**
Save offline — no cell on Hwy 99
- All campground reservations offline**
BC Parks fills up weeks ahead in summer
- Travel insurance documents**
- BC health cards (or out-of-province)**
- Cash**
Some campgrounds and small stops are cash only
- Downloaded offline maps**
Google Maps, AllTrails, Gaia GPS
- BC Parks app with reservations**
- iOverlander downloaded**
For dump stations and overnight spots
- Emergency contacts written down**
Not just in your phone

■ TECH & ENTERTAINMENT

- Phone + all charging cables**
- Portable power bank**
For hike days away from the RV
- Camera + spare memory cards**
Sea to Sky is incredibly photogenic
- USB adapters / power bar**
Maximise RV plug points for the group
- Kindle / books / magazines**
For rainy days and slow evenings
- Card games or travel board game**
Highly recommend — evenings are the best part
- Plug adapter (if non-Canadian)**
Canada uses Type B / NEMA 5-15 outlets

■ KIDS' ENTERTAINMENT

- Stuffed animals** — Whistler prices are much higher.
- Sticker books** — Whistler prices are much higher.
- Coloring books** — Whistler prices are much higher.
- Activity books** — Whistler prices are much higher.
- Books** — Whistler prices are much higher.
